It can transform and upgrade the healthcare ecosystem in the country. Since it focuses on the two crucial components – financial protection to poor and economically weaker section of households and strengthening the primary healthcare delivery system. It also presents a strong case for public-private partnership that is linked to specific measurable goals. However, being the most populous state of the country, it will certainly face numerous challenges in comparison to other states. It already has a low healthcare spending and poor healthcare infrastructure so it needs to maintain quality within its ecosystem while upgrading and innovating new models.
